Mufaro and Blessed's stories are some of the few we got a chance to hear. We are yet to discover more however it is not yet possible for us to launch a survey because we have not yet been cleared to operate. We have also faced challenges in trying to find out about our beneficiaries different stories' because of the sensitivity of the topic and the stigma associated with HIV/AIDS. Therefore people are not willing to openly share about orphans who have lost their parents to HIV/AIDS.



We engaged young people to introduce the Mukundi Drive pilot project. Our main goal with this project is to mitigate the spread of HIV and AIDS by targeting a group that is according to research susceptible to HIV infection. We use game that has components that encourage the participants to understand reality. The picture on the right shows one of our sessions

Activities carried out

To familiarize ourselves with our beneficiaries, we carried out different activities with them, where we used art as a means of expression in terms of interests, aspirations, and knowledge about plants (this was done as a basis for our plant germination theme camp pilot project). The activity was highly interactive, and the children enjoyed the use of art, as shown in the picture on the left.

We will continue to pursue our clearance at the district offices and we will be engaging different NGOs to get an opportunity to carry out activities with our beneficiaries.
